



FACULTY ADVISOR GUIDELINES

We are delighted that one of your students has been selected to join the NetAid Global Citizen Corps in the 2007-2008 school year. All participants will work with the support of a faculty advisor, and we hope that you will take on this role for your student. Participation in the Global Citizen Corps is a unique opportunity to complement globally oriented programs at your school and to engage students in the fight against global poverty. Below you will find more information about your role as a faculty advisor.

What is the NetAid Global Citizen Corps?

The NetAid Global Citizen Corps is a one year leadership program designed to give emerging high school student leaders the resources and training they need to involve their peers in efforts to fight global poverty. Each year, NetAid/Mercy Corps selects a diverse group of exceptional high school students to become *Global Citizen Corps Leaders*. Throughout the year, these leaders work to implement a series of Global Action Days which raise awareness about pressing global issues and support larger poverty-fighting campaigns.

The following are designated Global Citizen Corps Global Action Days for the 2007-2008 school year:

October 16, 2007	Global Action Day: HUNGER
December 1, 2007	Global Action Day: HIV/AIDS
January 31, 2008	Global Action Day: Climate Change
April 21-25, 2008	Global Action Week: EDUCATION

What is the role of the Global Citizen Corps faculty advisor?

The role of the faculty advisor is to support the work of the Global Citizen Corps Leader in implementing Global Action Day activities at your school. This role is very flexible and may range from offering a classroom space for student meetings during lunch to assisting with the coordination of events or activities. Your level of involvement is entirely up to you.

While submitting a Global Citizen Corps Faculty Support Form indicates your commitment to serve as a liaison between the leader and your school's administration, the Global Citizen Corps is at its core a student-led program. Ultimately, it is up to each leader to use his/her own creativity to organize and implement a series of Global Action Days.
